Greetings from Huruma School!

It's a pleasure to write to you again and we thank God for sailing us through yet another month. The month of June has been both busy and exciting. We have been working tirelessly to complete the curriculum so that we can create ample time for the students to do their revision. So far our efforts have been worthwhile as we have successfully managed to complete the form four syllabus which is one of the critical classes that we have this year and who will be expected to sit for their final high school examination towards the end of this year.

Having completed the syllabus, teachers are now focusing on training them to conduct their own personal studies using different revision books which are specially tailor made to help candidates prepare for their final exams. On 22nd to 24th June the children also sat for midterm exams before they went on a short midterm break to evaluate what they have learnt for the first half of the term. High school results are yet to be released but the primary results are out and most children performed fairly well. Teachers have reported a slight improvement in performance compared to the opener exams and we hope and pray that they will continue with the same spirit of hard work and determination in order to achieve even better results by the end of the term. They are now back in school and learning is going on as planned.

Moving on to more exciting news! We had a team of volunteers from Cornerstone Church Arizona and they organized a two day teachers conference. We had an amazing time sharing and learning from one another on a wide array of topics ranging from goal setting, how to become better teachers, organizational skills both in the classroom and as a person among others. We also enjoyed a special treat of chips and chicken for lunch prepared by our very own chef at the Home and the conference was very successful. To wrap up the second day we went out for yoghurt and ice cream. We thank Cornerstone volunteers for thinking about us and for the wonderful work that they are doing to make Huruma a better place by sacrificing their time to train and equip our teachers with new knowledge and skills for the benefit of our

The Next Big Project

In 2009 God touched a man of God by the name Pastor Allan Kiuna during a church conference that Mama had attended and he donated 5 acres of very good land in an area called Gatune to the Home. This is a blessing that has since grown from little to becoming much and God has expanded and increased us beyond our imagination. Since then Mama has managed to acquire another 10 acres to make it 15 acres and we believe that this is just the beginning, God has plenty more in store for us!

We all know how much Mama struggles to feed her children and it is for this reason that this project is so close to her heart. Her dream is to develop the land purposely for farming so she can grow maize and beans for her children an idea that is expected to reduce the cost of buying food significantly. The most amazing thing is that when Mama first went to the place there were practically no roads and it was extremely difficult to access the land. In fact a story is told of how one time Mama went with some visitors to see the land and it rained so heavily that they got stuck and had to spend the night there thanks to one old lady who was kind enough to let them into her house. Now the roads have been done all the way to the farm and this is such a great relief and a blessing from God.

In addition God confirmed His promise in scripture that our boundaries will always fall in pleasant places. It so happens that the area has been earmarked by the government for the construction of a bypass road and a modern railway just adjacent to the farm and this means that the area will open up drastically in terms of all things development in the near future. This is all the doing of the Lord and it is truly marvelous in our eyes!

Gatune is characterized as a semi-arid area that borders Kajiado County, an area that is predominantly inhabited by the pastoral Maasai Community. The soil is very fertile but water scarcity is the greatest challenge. People are forced to walk for many kilometers in search of water for domestic, livestock and agricultural production. Climate change has also led to diminishing sources of water making rainwater the only alternative source. However majority of the people there live in a state of desperation

and hopelessness due to the many challenges that they face and women are left struggling to fend for their families and put a meal on the table. Mama envisions the project as a source of hope that will bring a new awakening to the communities around by demonstrating rainwater harvesting as an alternative source of water for agricultural production. With the little knowledge that she had she excavated a small shallow well to trap surface runoff and the well still stores some water when it rains.

Fortunately in 2014, Mama made contact with a rainwater harvesting technician who was involved in implementing rainwater harvesting projects and she benefited from a 50,000-litre rainwater harvesting structure that is lined to control water loss through seepage and roofed to prevent evaporation. Having learnt of the technology Mama felt the need to scale it up in order to maximize production and achieve the desired result. She shared the project concept with partners and friends of Huruma and this year an organization called Feeding Mouths, Feeling Minds has come on board to help fund phase 1 of the project which intends to construct a system that can hold upto 1, 000,000-litres of water. Mama also plans to adopt drip irrigation in order to help in water management and prevent wastage because every drop counts.

At the moment plans to fence the land is on-going and we are hoping to put an electric fence all around to keep off animals and especially monkeys which are very common in the area and are notorious for destroying crops. Fencing poles are currently under construction and will be erected soon to pave way for the start of the project. We also thank God because we recently got a permit to drill a borehole for the supply of clean drinking water. Mama intends to have a water kiosk in future to sell water to the community and hopefully help solve part of the water crisis while at the same time generating some extra income for Huruma. The dream is far from being realized but we are glad that we are making progress and we know that with God all things are possible.

Please keep this project in your prayers that God will make a way for it to happen far beyond what we are envisioning right now and bring it to a fruitful completion. We know that He makes all things beautiful in His time and while we are waiting to celebrate the complete package we will give thanks for every step we make as we
